## A Beginner's Guide to Military Healthcare System (Audiology & Otolaryngology)

**Austere/Remote Environment**: Environments where access to clean water, electricity and a fixed or mobile medical facility is significantly degraded or denied and where diagnostic and treatment resources and medical personnel are unavailable or limited for extended periods of time.

**Prolonged Field Care**: The need to provide patient care for extended periods of time in theater when evacuation or mission requirements surpass available capabilities and/or the capacity to provide that care.
